- I. Why does Paul focus on the imitation of Christ's "attitude"?
 - A. Christ's example teaches believers to forsake divisive attitudes (1:27; 2:2-4; 2:14).
 - B. Christian unity is crucial for the advancement of the gospel (1:27; John 17:21).
- II. What is this passage teaching us about the Lord Jesus Christ?
 - A. Who He Was Before His Incarnation Fully and completely God (v.6, John 1:1; 17:5).
 - B. Who He Become During His Incarnation A human being who retained his deity, but laid aside his divine rights and privileges (vv.7-8a; Colossians 2:9).
 - C. What He Chose A humiliating death as an act of obedience to God (v.8b).
 - D. What He Gained Universal honor (vv.9-11).
