 - A. Characterization: Heavenly citizens (3:20).
 - B. Conduct:
 - 1. They live with an eternal perspective (3:20-21; Colossians 3:1-16).
 - 2. They relentlessly pursue Christlikeness (3:17).
 - 3. They are enthusiastically affirming (3:15-16; 4:1).
 - C. Destiny: Transformation (3:21).
