II. Captivity at Jerusalem (21:17-39)

- A. Paul in Jerusalem: Paul was...
 - 1. Misunderstood by the Zealous Jewish Believers (vv 17-26)

One can be Flexible in Practice (1 Corinthians 9:20), without Violating Biblical Conviction

- 2. Falsely Accused by his Jewish Adversaries (vv 27-31a)
- 3. Mis-identified by the Roman Official (vv 31b-39)
- B. The Cause of Misunderstanding, False-accusation or Mis-identification comes from the Root problem of "Pre-suppositions" or "Perceptions". To avoid the Mistakes:
 - 1. Verify "Character" and Source Information
 - 2. Check one's own Attitude: Objective and without "Prejudice"
 - 3. Be Careful with "Association" Humans are Complex Beings

III. Lessons for Us

A. Value Human Relationships

Not Gossip about others, Verify Information; do not Assume based on Prejudice; and do not "Associate" too quickly
