II. Lifestyle: Legalism or Licentiousness?

Grace Supersedes the Plane of Legalism and Licentiousness

- A. The Error of Legalism (Galatians 1:6-7; 3:1-3)
 - 1. Human Performance based on Legalistic Rules Plays No Role in one's Salvation, nor in one's Consecration (Galatians 3:6)
 - 2. To Follow Legalistic Rules is to Return to Slavery (Galatians 5:1)
- B. The Error of Licentious Living (Galatians 5:13-14; cf. Titus 2:11-13)

III. Lifestyle Characterized by Grace

- A. The Fact of the New Birth: Spiritual DNA and "New Nature"
 - 2 Natures in the Believer: The Sin Nature and the New Nature
- B. The Holy Spirit and a Grace-based Lifestyle (Galatians 5:16-17): Believers are to "Live by the Spirit" (cf. 2 Peter 3:18)
 - 1. Grow in Knowledge of the Lord Jesus: Crave for the Word of God

The Holy Spirit will help the Believer Develop a Biblical Worldview to Replace the Secular Worldview

2. Grow in the Grace of the Lord Jesus: Deepen Relationship by Pursuing Grace/Christ

Grace-based Principles will Lead to the <u>Transformation</u> of Life and Lifestyle, and a <u>Transformed Life</u> will Produce a Christ-like Character (Galatians 5:22-24)
