The Ten Commandments (6): Valuing Life Exodus 20:13

I. The Meaning of the Sixth Commandment

A. Killing that God does not define as murder:

- 1. Capital punishment for the unlawful taking of another's life (Genesis 9:6; Romans 13:4).
- 2. Self-defense that may result in the death of another (Exodus 22:2; Nehemiah 4:16; Esther 9:16).
- 3. Accidental death (Exodus 21:13).
- 4. Death as the result of justifiable war (Deuteronomy 20).
- B. Killing that God does define as murder:
 - 1. Homicide (Numbers 35:20-21).
 - 2. Infanticide and abortion (Exodus 21:22-25).

II. The Reason for the Sixth Commandment

- A. Man is made in the image and likeness of God (Genesis 1:26-27; 9:6).
- B. Remembering that man is made in the image of God, should eliminate all prejudice and discrimination.

III. The Challenge of the Sixth Commandment

- A. Seek to understand the reasons for your anger (Matthew 5:22; Genesis 4:3-7).
- B. Refrain from voicing disrespectful comments about others (Matthew 5:22b; James 1:19).
- C. Recognize that it is always our responsibility to pursue reconciliation (Matthew 5:23-26).
